Together we can make a difference.

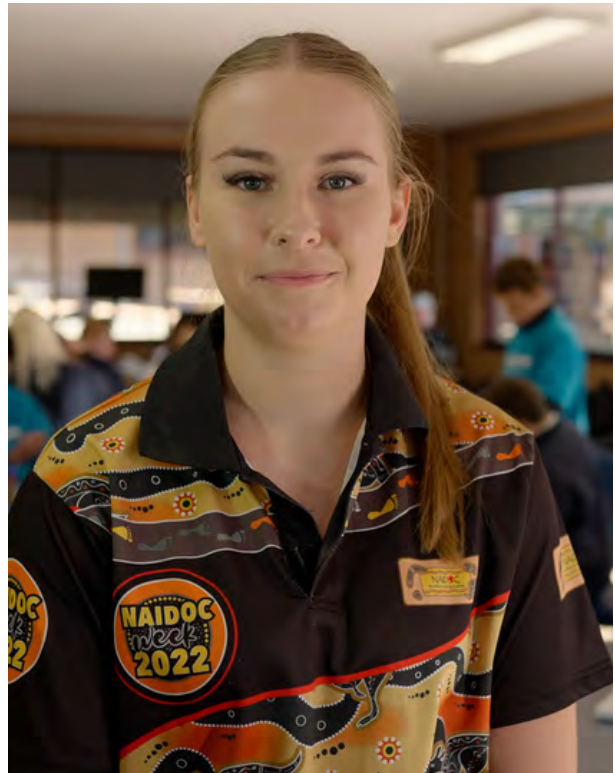

Youth Solutions has delivered health promotion and harm prevention programs to students at Elizabeth Macarthur High School, in Narellan Vale, for a number of years.

It's been a rewarding relationship. Our educators enjoy the opportunity to deliver programs to engaged students eager to learn new things about health and wellbeing and who embrace the safe space for discussion and to ask questions. Youth Solutions' programs focus on learning, participation and support, and we work hard to ensure they are inclusive, culturally appropriate and serve the needs of young people in the Macarthur and Wingecarribee areas.

MEET KEIGHLEY

Keighley Newans is a Student Learning Support Officer (Aboriginal Education) at Elizabeth Macarthur High School. Keighley shares how her students have been positively impacted by Youth Solutions' health and wellbeing programs delivered at the school.



"The way you design the program - you work in small groups, the educators are personable, the workshops are flexible according to the year group, there's an icebreaker at the start - is a comfortable space for the students," Ms Newans said.

"They ask questions, they discuss things, and they share personal experiences.

"It's so different from a classroom, where there's lots of students and it can get distracting. They're more engaged and get so much more out of a small group."

Ms Newans highlighted Youth Solutions' ARTucation program, that combines harm prevention messaging with creative cultural activities.

"The First Nations students adore it; it's such a positive experience for them. They learn about wellbeing and mental health then they get to engage with their culture through art," Ms Newans said.

She says the students gain a "deeper knowledge" of health and wellbeing through the Youth Solutions activities and learn strategies around resilience and decision-making to make better choices for themselves.

"I've seen it particularly around students' friendships, where they've learnt the difference between positive and toxic relationships," she explained.

"Our kids are making better choices for the future." There is also a positive flow-on effect from the Youth Solutions' workshops to teachers.

"We see what areas the students are interested in, which we may have been unaware of previously, and we can incorporate that into lessons. We also get an insight into students from their personal experiences, and this gives us more awareness about them as individuals," Ms Newans said.

She added her goal would be to continue the connection with Youth Solutions for as long as possible. "I'd love us to get to the stage where we say, 'it's that time of the year, we're meeting up with Youth Solutions'."



MEET AJ

AJ has been a valued Youth Advisory Group (YAG) volunteer since 2022. She has participated in training, facilitated peer-led presentations and supported our health promotion campaigns.

Tell us about yourself, AJ...

I am a full-time University student in my first year, studying a Bachelor of Branded Fashion Design. A typical week in my life consists of working two jobs Monday to Saturday, after and before my university classes. Every morning and night I read to calm myself down for sleep or for the day ahead, and I am currently reading "Before the Coffee Gets Cold" by Toshikazu Kawaguchi! Sunday is my rest day, whether it be for myself or to socialise with friends or family.

Why did you join YAG?

I joined YAG to enhance my knowledge on certain topics to benefit myself, but also to benefit my friends and family. I wanted to do exactly what Youth Solutions' goal is: to help young people be healthy, safe, connected, and prevent them from experiencing AOD-related harms. I share all knowledge with my loved ones to ensure their safety and I am so grateful to do the same with other young people.



I love being able to help people, whether it is a life changing assistance, or just to help them decide what to eat for breakfast. It's a fulfilling and warm feeling.

What's your favourite memory from YAG?

A favourite memory from YAG would have to be the monthly community drop-ins to Oran Park's Community Centre. It's a privilege to listen to these young people and having the ability to be that person who can give them beneficial feedback and knowledge regarding their situation. I can be someone who they can willingly share their thoughts with.

DAIR

ARTUCATION

ARTucation is an alcohol and other drug education program which incorporates learnings of creative expression and connection to culture. The project is for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people and their peers. An exciting development in 2022 – 2023 was the introduction of ceramics to the cultural activities on offer, facilitated by local Aboriginal and Torres Strait creatives.

The Peer Enrichment and Empowerment Project is a youth training program which seeks to build the capacity of youth volunteers to plan, deliver and evaluate youth-specific health promotion activities, specifically through the SAFE series (Drive SAFE and Party SAFE).

Youth Solutions delivers peer-led presentations to increase young people's knowledge of how alcohol and drugs can affect driving. The project aims to help young people develop safety strategies as well as navigate support options.

HEALTH PRO+

Health Pro+ has built on years of foundational work by Youth Solutions with tertiary education students in the medical and health disciplines. Together with support from our Project Partner, Campbelltown Catholic Club, Youth Solutions sought to solidify this work into a stand-alone project, supported with a complementary campaign.

The project and campaign meet the identified need for AOD education and support for the next generation of community service and health professionals. This project aims to increase the knowledge, supports and skills of students studying in medical, youth and community service fields, to equip these emerging professionals to better support those experiencing drug, alcohol and mental health concerns.

IT STARTS WITH US CAMPAIGN

It Starts With Us ran alongside Health Pro+, to bring self-care and supporting others to the forefront for tertiary education students. The multifaceted campaign engaged with students from disciplines such as health, medicine, youth and social work, and the broader community, to share practical strategies for effective self-care and supporting others around drug, alcohol, mental health and related wellbeing issues.

The campaign also saw 1541 promotional items distributed, 2 EDMs sent to 1500+ subscribers and multiple media articles and interviews to share its messages with the community. Campaign videos on TikTok garnered 4307 views and 184 likes, while the campaign content on Facebook, Instagram and LinkedIn helped to achieve 10,203 engagements (likes, comments and shares) on these platforms across the campaign period.

SPORTS AWARE

In 2022 – 2023 Youth Solutions piloted the Sports AWARE program, in partnership with Wests Group Macarthur, with two local sporting codes. The program seeks to build young people's capacity to stay safe around alcohol and other drugs, build their help-seeking skills and be a good role model for their team mates.
